**Objectives** The purpose of this course is to examine and critically assess a number of key concepts and issues associated with behaviour in organisations. Specific Organisational Behaviour models, approaches and methodologies are addressed and the course provides frameworks and tools for introducing and sustaining organisational effectiveness. It focuses initially on various aspects of **individual** and **group** behaviour and then proceeds to examine issues relating to **leadership**, **power and politics**, **communication** and **conflict management**. The course is organized around readings, discussions and lectures.
