4. Course Description & Contents

This course is a compulsory requirement for majoring & minoring in Islamic Studies that includes classical, rational and comprehensive study of prophetic(PBUH), hadith literature and its sciences. The prime objective of this course is to develop students understanding about Hadith (a second source of Islamic law) which inculcate how to, build harmonious lives and to make responsible and ethical citizen of the state. The course effectively develops; learning faculties of the students and assist them to prepare themselves as informed, empowered and responsible citizens through multiple rational discussions and exercises. Students also learn how Muhadeseen put their best efforts to explain the true sense of prophet's traditions for the betterment of the pluralistic societies. The course also compels students to think critically, response decently and act responsibly with their fellow human being. The contents include, but not limited to, the following:

- The importance of Man and the smart way to become successful in the entire worlds.
- Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) as a ROLE MODEL in building humanity.
- Hadith and its sciences, meaning, terminologies, principles and barriers/Conditions to accept authentic narrations.
- History, compilation and development of Hadith traditions and its effectiveness on character building.
- Hadith as a source of legitimation (A second source of Islamic Law)
- Hadith-based social, moral and ethical teachings and practices of the Prophet to develop harmonious, professional, responsible and best informed human.

5. Course Ethics and Policies

For the successful qualification of the course, students must maintain at least 80% attendance (punctuality marks will be given beyond 80%), show good behavior and learning attitude, do beforehand readings, meet deadlines for assignments, do activities inside/outside of the classroom, and act upon the values and policies of the FCC. At the end of the course each student will submit a reflective journal (maximum three pages) about the impact of learning in your attitude, behavior, beliefs, knowledge, and skills etc.
